ACCESSibility Documentation Guidelines

The Office of ACCESSibility is here to ensure that Mercy College is accessible to all students. If a student requires accommodations or auxiliary aides due to a disability, as outlined in the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), we are here to help! We also serve students who are pregnant or nursing, students who require accommodations for religious observations/ personal beliefs, and students who have been recently injured.

In order to verify eligibility for our services, a student must submit documentation from their treating health care provider or qualified diagnostician. Please keep in mind that accommodation requests are considered on a case by case basis.

Types of documentation that may be helpful to provide are:

- · Educational, psychological, or medical records
- Reports, assessments, or evaluations from healthcare providers, clinical psychologists, licensed social workers, or school psychologists
- Documents that outline use of academic accommodations such as an IEP, 504 Plan, or list of approved
 accommodations from a previous institution

Documentation MUST include:

- 1. A statement identifying the nature of the disability experienced by the student.
 - Diagnosis, type of health issue, etc.
- A description of the functional impact of the disability. The functional limitation is a description of how the student's disability affects the student in an academic setting.
 - · What symptoms does the student experience?
 - How does this effect their ability to function in the classroom?
 - What challenges does the student experience in relation to their studies?
- Any treatments, medications, services, or assistive devices currently prescribed, their level of
 effectiveness, and potential side effects from medications as they might relate to school.
- 4. Information stating the certification, licensure, and/or qualification of the individual providing the supporting documentation (documenting professional). Documentation must be provided in an uneditable format (ex: PDF) on letterhead, signed, and include the licensed professional's title, license number, address, and phone number.
 - Documenting professional must be a qualified professional whose credentials demonstrate expertise in the respective field.
 - · Documenting professional may not be related to the student.

This list is not comprehensive. The following are listed as <u>examples</u>. All documentation will be evaluated on a case by case basis. The Office of ACCESSibility may require additional documentation if documentation provided does not fully support the request being made.

Request due to:	Examples of Limitations:	Examples of Supporting Documentation
Learning Disability	Difficulty with speaking, reading, concentrating, thinking, processing, etc.	High School IEP, 504 plan, school evaluations, achievement tests.
Vision and Hearing	Deaf, hard of hearing, blind, low vision, color blindness, light sensitivity, etc.	If disability is not apparent, a letter and/or evaluation may be required from a medical professional.
Caring for Oneself	Difficulty with breathing, sleeping, eating, and/or communicating.	If disability is not apparent, a letter and/or evaluation may be required from a medical professional.
Performing Manual Tasks	Difficulty with walking, standing, lifting, bending, working, and/or other mobility impairments.	If disability is not apparent, a letter and/or evaluation may be required from a medical professional.
Major Bodily Functions	Digestive, immune system, respiratory, circulatory, and neurological conditions.	A letter and/or evaluation from a medical professional.
Psychological	Diagnosis of anxiety, depression, bipolar, mood disorders, personality disorders, dissociative disorder, PTSD, ADD/ADHD, etc.	A letter and/or evaluation from a medical professional.
Allergy	Documented allergic reaction (ex: food items, latex, etc.) that may interfere with course work.	A letter and/or evaluation from a medical professional.
Pervasive Developmental Disorder	Diagnosis of Autism, Autism Spectrum, Asperger's, PDD-NOS, etc.	High School IEP, 504 plan, school evaluations, achievement tests.
Other Medical Condition	Injury (temporary or permanent), side effects of medical treatment, etc.	A letter and/or evaluation from a medical professional.
Religious or Personal Beliefs	Requests related to food preferences, absences, classroom content, etc.	Discussed on an individual basis with The Office of ACCESSibility
Housing Requests	Requests for Emotional Support Animal, single unit, gender-related requests, assistive devices, etc.	*Certain housing requests require additional forms; please contact ACCESS team as soon as possible to discuss your request.
Pregnancy/ Nursing Mothers	Requests related to medical issues/ concerns as a result of pregnancy or nursing	A letter from medical professional.
